## Garden jobs in Autumn...

Feeding UK birds in winter is essential to help them survive colder months when their natural food sources such as berries and insects are scarce. Putting out nuts, seeds and suet in your garden gives them the essential energy to provide themselves with warmth as the temperature drops. By feeding birds and putting out fresh water, we support their health and improve their chances of thriving through the challenging season, adding a small amount of glycerine to the water helps stop it freezing.



## Amazing amaryllis...

I absolutely love to plant an Amaryllis bulb in November. I always find it incredible to watch how tall they grow in a short period of time. Amaryllis flowers are often associated with hope, rebirth, and festive cheer, especially since they bloom in winter. Adding beautiful bright colours to gloomy winter days. I like to plant my bulb in a glass vase and decorate around the bulb with moss, pine cones and other winter finds.

#### To plant the bulb:

- Choose a pot slightly larger than the bulb, with good drainage, or add a good layer of grit in the bottom.
- Fill the pot with well-draining soil, positioning the bulb so that the top third sits above the soil line.
- Place it in a warm, sunny location indoors and water lightly to settle the soil. Water sparingly until you see new growth, then increase watering, keeping the soil lightly moist but not soggy.
- In 6-8 weeks, you should see vibrant blooms, making it a perfect winter-flowering plant to brighten up your indoor space.



## No dahlia drama here!...

Dahlias have become a staple in my garden as they come in such a huge array of colours and styles. They make the most beautiful addition to any floral arrangement, but as autumn approaches, dahlia growers often face a decision: should they lift and store the tubers or leave them in the ground over winter? I have experimented with both options and have come to the conclusion that lifting is better. This is due to the risk of colder weather (often below freezing) which can kill the tubers and turn them to mush!

If we have a long wet winter which is common in the UK along with poor draining soil, the tubers simply rot away. I grow Dahlias in pots and simply move the pots into the greenhouse to protect from frost over winter. Lifting also gives you the opportunity to split tubers for even more plants next year!


